MARGARET RECEIVES SCHOOL CHEF LIFETIME ACHIEVEMENT AWARD



Margaret Blairy, who recently retired from her role as Mandeville Primary school's head chef, where she worked for over four decades, has been crowned the winner of Chefs in Schools' inaugural Lifetime Achievement Award.

Over her 42 years of service, it's estimated Margaret served up around 2 million school meals, serving on average 250 pupils every school day.

As well as her work in the kitchen, during Covid Margaret helped set up the free food shop giving away food to local families and free school meals to children who needed them.

She hung up her school chef apron last year but was lured from retirement to speak at the recent Chefs in Schools Sustainability Conference at the prestigious Fishmongers Hall. After the Q&A she was surprised with the award. Margaret said: *"I am lost for words. Thank you. I committed to the job because it was for the children. I loved to cook for them."*

The job was only intended to be a short-term role to fit around family commitments while Margaret raised her own children, but leaving became impossible.

Margaret said: *"I fell more and more in love with the job and the cooking and feeding the children. It was a highlight when the children would come to the kitchen and ask for a favourite recipe to take home for their parents to cook. That was inspiring. What's kept me going is I found I was committed to making sure that the children were well fed. School food has changed a lot in forty-two years. It's no longer custard and cake or sponge with jam. There's a lot more fruit and vegetables, less sugar and salt. It's healthier now. It's nice that things change and for the better. It's good for the children and there's always something new to learn. It's a very rewarding job. It's nice when the children walk in and appreciate the food or come in through the gates excited to ask what's for lunch?"*

Louise, LEAP's Executive Headteacher and co-founder of Chefs in Schools, presented the award to Margaret. Louise said: *"Margaret was so important to the community and she embraced every challenge. The food was always great but when I wanted to change the menus and brought Nicole Pisani (Executive Chef at*

Chefs in School) in to help us make it all from scratch, Margaret took it in her stride and made the food even better. Margaret is the kind of person who takes every idea and runs with it. She is very missed at the school and we are so grateful for everything she's done."

When asked how she'd like to be remembered at the school and what her legacy is, Margaret told the conference: *"I would like to be remembered as the chef who loved her job, loved cooking, loved serving the clients – and I mean the children because without them we wouldn't have a job, so I called them my clients. For my legacy, it would be the jerk chicken with rice and peas and the jollof rice. We were all proud of those dishes. And I shouldn't forget my Christmas tree biscuits – the children will miss those!"*

WRAPAROUND CARE

Mandeville Wraparound Care is open to all children, from nursery to Year 6. We provide children with a healthy breakfast in the morning and a range of engaging activities in both Breakfast Club and Playcentre.

Breakfast Club timings: 7.45am-8.50am. Breakfast is served until 8.30am.

Breakfast Club cost: £1 a day per child or family unit. FSM pay 50p a day

Play Centre: From **Monday 15th September 2025**, Play Centre costs will increase to £5 for 1 hour and £10 for 2 hours. For those eligible for FSM, any session will cost £5. This change helps us cover rising costs while continuing to provide a safe and engaging service.

AFTER SCHOOL CLUBS

After school activity clubs will begin w/c Monday 15th Sept and will run for twelve weeks, finishing on Thursday 11th Dec. Club information will be sent out to all children on Monday and bookings will open on Monday 8th Sept at 7pm. To book and secure a place for your child, please log into your Arbor online account.

Cost: Clubs cost £20 per club per term, payable in advance.

Children eligible for Pupil Premium are entitled to one free after school club each term. To book a Pupil Premium Grant (PPG) space, please contact the school office directly. If you are unsure whether your child qualifies for PPG, the office will be happy to advise.
