BLACK HISTORY MONTH FOR KEY STAGE 1

Our Black History Month celebrations have been a great success in Reception and Years 1 & 2. Children from Reception class started their week by discussing what World War One was and why it is important to remember the black soldiers who fought during it. The children learnt about Remembrance Day and made poppies to signify it. *"I liked making the red and black poppies and learning about black soldiers fighting in the war"* **Sofia.**



The children spent time creating hand prints which they painted the same colour as their skin. After this, the children created army medals. The children learnt about different famous black soldiers including **Walter Tull**. They created impressive portraits of these famous black soldiers.



Year 1 and 2 had a fantastic time learning about **Eugene Bullard**. *"He was one of the first ever African American fighter pilots during World War One and he had nine brothers and sisters!"* **Jemimah.**

The children wrote wonderful letters, from the perspective of Eugene to his parents, which were then printed on parachutes.

In class, the children made aeroplanes from recycled materials.



BLACK HISTORY MONTH FOR KS1 CONTINUED.....

The children visited the **RAF museum** where they learnt about fighter planes used during World War One. The children learnt about a range of different planes. They looked at symbols on the planes which were connected to different countries. The children were then given the opportunity to make and fly their own planes!

He has published several books showcasing his amazing art work and was awarded an MBE in 2006 the same year he opened his art gallery. He inspired us to create some London landmarks.

We also spoke about Black History Month and our visit to the RAF museum. We have been learning about the 1st black pilot Eugene Bullard. He spoke 3 languages and was awarded 3 medals for bravery during World War 1. We think he was very brave to leave his family and work as a spy.



YEAR 3 & 4 NEWS

To celebrate Black History month, Year 3 and 4 went on a trip all the way to the **National Army Museum** in Sloane Square. It was a long journey and the trains were very busy. However, the children were very sensible and even offered their seats to members of the public. All the teachers were very proud of their behaviour on all of the different modes of transport.

Once at the museum, the children got to explore and learn about the different wars and interact with different activities in groups. They attended a workshop, looking closely at

recruitment posters, their purpose and the different styles and slogans. This experience helped them to create their own posters, pursuing the men of 1914 to join the war. There was so much interest and enthusiasm, it was a great week!
