Tyrese – "I liked the kick rounders because we worked as a team!"

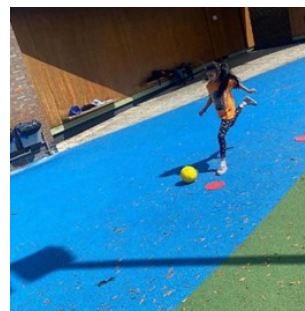
Jadon – "I enjoyed the competitiveness of the penalty kick outs."

MANDEVILLE JRSO'S ROAD SAFETY FILM

Road Safety is important! Have you ever been distracted by your phone as you crossed a road? Have you ever been messing around with friends and almost fallen on the road? Have you ever crossed the road without looking? Our Junior Road Safety Officers (JRSOs) decided to highlight these problems in a fun and creative way by using multimedia. The JRSOs spent some time scripting the different scenes, with props such as mobile phones, coats and a bike. "I loved riding the bike as I kept pretending to fall off like a stuntman," **Kurtis**. They then filmed the scenes with lots of retakes needed! They had to focus on sound and light as it was a noisy day with a lot of sunlight. "The hardest bit was making sure everyone could be heard" **Zainab**. The team then edited the short scenes into a film.

SCHOOL COUNCILLORS EXPLORE SUSTAINABILITY AT HSOF

During the final week of last term, Mandeville School Councillors met with Chef Tom, at the Hackney School of Food, as part of their sustainability campaign. They learnt about regenerative farming, how important compost is and food sourcing. The children spent time learning about what compost is & why it's important.

"I didn't realise our food goes to a compost heap and that it then helps new plants grow" **Kalani**.

The children enjoyed chatting with Lidka, our school gardener, about using compost to help nourish growing plants. The children explored

what food sourcing is. They learnt that flying in food, like oranges and lemons from Italy, typically creates around 10 times more carbon emissions than road transport and around 50 times more than shipping.

"I didn't realise how important it is to try to source food locally!"
