
READING AT LEAP

Reading is at the heart of your child's learning at school. Becoming an independent learner depends strongly on a child becoming a skilful reader, so we have daily reading lessons and it is built into all areas of the LEAP curriculum.


Lessons at school are built in the early years around working on fluency. In **phonics**, children learn which sounds (phonemes) are linked to which letters (graphemes) and how these build to make words. Phonics is a vital first step in reading and spelling. Your child learns and practises phonics daily, often in small groups and the teaching is planned to match their skills.

Children in **Reception and Year 1** will bring home a 'phonically decodable' book (like those shown below) to practise the sounds they have been taught at school.

Please encourage your child to point at the words and blend known sounds to read the words.



Alongside systematic phonics practice, we think it is important that children also read natural language books. These books support an enjoyment of reading and give opportunities for discussion e.g. making links to what they have experienced or know.



From **Year 2-Year 6** children continue to have daily reading lessons planned around refining fluency and practising different strategies to understand a text. During these lessons children also practise written reading comprehension skills, which will be vital when they move on to secondary school. Every week, children in Year 2 - 6 are given a book to practise reading at home, aligned to your child's reading fluency. Please listen to your child read and talk with them about the book.

READING AT HOME

Making reading an enjoyable part of the daily routine will support your child enormously in their learning. Aim to have books visible where children can reach them during play and relaxation as well as study time.

Your child will benefit if you read with them, read to them and listen to them read whatever age they are. All LEAP children have daily reading lessons at school. It is by reading at home with an adult that a child will apply those skills additionally and quickly make them part of their own repertoire.

Please take care of the reading books your child brings home from school. We have a very limited budget and cannot always replace lost books. The cost of a single book is about £5. We hope you will enjoy and take care of the precious books and return them to school.

If your child needs more to read, please visit the local libraries. Joining the library is free and easy - find out how to <u>here</u>. The libraries in Hackney have a fantastic range of up-to-date books and children can borrow as many as 8 books to enjoy at home- **at no cost**. If there is a particular author or topic in which your child is interested, the librarian will order books for them. It is a brilliant resource that we are lucky to have in Hackney!
